

	levels of quality rres (3 - 4)	The child care area provides a level of quality that meets minimal standards; some, but not all elements may promote higher quality learning experiences. Typically, child care spaces that fall within this range of quality have enough spac for children, providers, play materials, and furnishings. The child care space is in good repair, clean, and well-maintained, but the area may not feel spacious. Access to the child care area may not be available for individuals with disabilities currently using the child care area, or there might not be a way to control natural light or ventilation.
